To end with a quote of Herophilus "When health is absent, wisdom cannot reveal itself, strength cannot fight, intelligence cannot be applied, art cannot become manifest, wealth becomes useless" It was through the gift of our silent mentors that we begin our journey to bring this health back to those around us.
