She believes that effective translation of research findings to practice and policy is needed to create meaningful impacts to improve population health. Her research work uses a range of quantitative and qualitative methodologies to support evidence-based health services development. She has a special interest in models of geriatric and palliative care. Notably, she co-led the evaluation of the national Advance Care Planning programme version 1.0 and is currently contributing to efforts to translate evidence-to-practice as the vice-chairperson of the national ACP quality framework development and implementation workgroup.
