Over the past 20 years since returning to Singapore, she received research grants totalling over \$14M as PI with external grants from A*Star, MOH and NRF to work on projects in telehealth, patient care, elderly and technologies. Dr Theng has participated in numerous research projects as PI, Co-I and Collaborator with more than 300 publications published widely in international journals and conferences.
