“Problem Based Learning: An Integrated Curriculum”

The concept of curriculum integration has been under debate on an on-going basis over the last half-century; with a resurgence occurring in the late 1960s when *problem-based learning* was introduced and pioneered by McMaster University in Hamilton, Canada. *Problem-based learning* is now more than just a buzzword; its pedagogical approach is increasingly acknowledged around the world as a critical process that fosters, and is more conducive to greater academic performance, satisfaction, and success through higher curriculum integration and coherence. The purpose of this presentation is to outline and explain how curriculum integration can be achieved using the *problem-based learning* process.
