

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This 5 day program will focus on curricular planning strategies, the investigation of current and newly developed curricular models, and the interdependence between the training and education of healthcare professionals and the anticipated demands of healthcare systems of the future. The program will provide a forum for a panel of international thinkers and innovators to examine significant issues relevant to the field of academic medicine today and through group dialogue address these challenges and opportunities from a number of perspectives.

Program faculty and participants will:

- Create strategies that address the linkage between the education of health care professional and the quality of health care
- Examine methods and processes that optimize the implementation of such strategies
- Critically assess the appropriate outcomes metrics to assure and gauge success.
- Develop methodologies for enhancing the capabilities of professionals leading these efforts.
- Explore advanced technological support systems to both deliver and monitor the quality of training and health care delivery.

COURSE DESCRIPTION (cont'd)

The program is intensive, incorporating a variety of interactive teaching and learning formats, including case discussions in small and large groups; presentations; journal clubs and consultative action & scenario planning groups. The faculty will draw upon literature, case studies, and models of professional education from fields inside and outside of academic medicine. Pre-work assignments and readings will help establish individual and institutional program goals.

Topics of discussion will include:

- Curriculum design, implementation and assessment
- Curriculum development as an issue of process management and improvement
- The changing nature of the academic medical institution
- Differences between competency-based and knowledge-based curricular approaches
- Innovative curricular models that have been implemented around the world
- Regional, national and international accreditation issues.
