“Medical Simulation: Pushing The Boundaries”

Simulation has been shown to be effective in teaching of basic science, improving medical knowledge and hands-on skills and decision making. Increasingly, simulation has also been used in patient safety teaching, team training and assessment. We describe our experience in peer-to-peer patient safety teaching using simulation, multi-disciplinary team training and use of simulation in assessment. We will discuss literature in support as well as challenges related to use of simulation in these areas. We expect increased use of simulation and foresee the eventual indispensable need for simulation in medical education and assessment.
