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Course Description

Problem-Based Learning (PBL) is a strategic combination of educational elements to optimise the educational outcomes of student-centred learning. The PBL strategy consists mainly of learning in intensive and collaborative small group tutorials using a problem to trigger student learning- i.e. to initiate brainstorming, discussions and identification of learning issues. PBL also integrates learning in the context of knowledge application to resolve real medical problems. PBL also involves learning through social interaction and reflection. This workshop will give you the theory, demonstrate how it is done and provide you with a hands-on session where you can practise what you have learned, i.e. learning by doing.
