The focus of the workshop is for the participants to learn from business community how best to mentor trainees to achieve excellence in building talent.

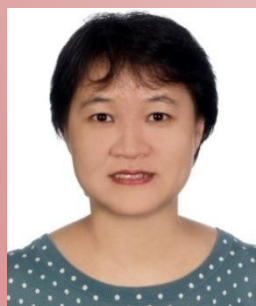
Outcomes
