The Introduction of the Residency Program and Its Impact on Students: A Singapore Perspective

The introduction of the Residency program has been a recent initiative in Singapore with the aims of increasing structure and formative training for post-graduate medical professionals. However, the consequence of its rapid implementation has resulted in confusion around the student body on the selection criteria and pre-requisites expected of undergraduates.

A perceptive survey will be carried out amongst Medical students in their clinical years (years 3-5) as well as post-graduates of the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, both non-residents and residents. A similar survey will be carried out on members of the residency core-faculty and restructured hospital general faculty staff. Domains such as grades, research and the commitment to extra-curricular activities will be evaluated.

We aim to evaluate the congruency of perceptions between students and core faculty staff on the selection criteria for residency and in turn, to re-align students to the original focus of medicine, to be a good doctor.
