Attitudes, Knowledge and Behaviour in Medical Students Towards Alcohol and Alcohol Use



The survey aims to examine the level of attitudes and knowledge towards alcohol and alcohol use; as well as to measure alcohol use among the medical undergraduates. It includes pre-clinical and clinical years to allow response comparison between groups. Targeted sampling is used. This project attempts to examine students' level of competence and confidence in handling substance abuse and also their own personal view in substance use such as alcohol and tobacco. Confidentiality and anonymity are maintained and the project may be carried out in later phases including mixed methods and randomised trial following skills teaching. The participants may be interested to know more about themselves before stepping into the real-world.
