# Cross Sectional Study of Perceptions of Qualities of a Good Medical Teacher among Medical Students from First to Final Year



Determining desirable medical teacher characteristics has implications for faculty development and selection. A questionnaire was administered to a total of 917 Year 1 to 5 medical students in the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine. Four top desirable characteristics were common across Year 1 to 5 students: good communication skills, sound knowledge of subject, enthusiasm, and providing effective explanations.
