## “Micro-Cex” For Medical Undergraduates: Less Is For More



Micro-CEX is a new medical undergraduate formative assessment for Ophthalmology. Compared to mini-CEX, it involves shorter but more sessions of feedback and focused assessments of entrusted professional activities using standardised case scenarios and questions. It assesses examination technique and targeted history taking on patients with pathology or healthy volunteers (with slides showing pathology). The rubric score is dependent the number of completed performance standards and correct answers. The CEX and End-Posting Test Scores of the students were compared; The students' and tutors' perception on 13 micro-CEX test characteristics (compared to mini-CEX) were also surveyed. The study results will be presented and discussed.
