# Perceptions of Characteristics of Effective Clinical Teachers among Medical Students and Residents in an Asian Healthcare Setting



The purpose of this study is to explore the perceived characteristics of an effective clinical teacher among medical students compared to residents graduating from an Asian medical school, and specifically whether there are differences between cognitive and non-cognitive domain skills, to inform faculty development. Using a pragmatic qualitative research design, maximal variation sampling of 6 final year medical students at the Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore, and 6 residents from the NUHS Residency programme, was done through semi-structured one-on-one interviews. Analysis was done using a 3 step approach based on principles of Grounded Theory.
