"Better understanding of EPA and the difference between milestones and EPA"

Course Description

Today, an *outcome-based* education (OBE) model is strongly advocated for the design and delivery of 21st century health professional curriculum: the professional competencies required for future practice are defined in terms of the intended learning outcomes (i.e. the **k**nowledge, **s**kills, **a**ttitudes) formulated from and aligned to the end-product capability (i.e. the desired attributes of the end-product) identified. Learners need to provide evidence of having acquired the desired professional competencies by **passing examinations** which use assessment tools (e.g. MEQs, OSCEs) designed for such a purpose.

However, in the *clinical setting* (i.e. in the *work environment*), it is recommended that learners need to show evidence that they have acquired desired professional competencies by *independently performing* a given set of *professional tasks*, after a period of learning under supervision. Such 'professional tasks' performed by the learner independently are referred to as the *'Entrustable Professional Activities (EPAs)*. Workplace-based assessments tools (e.g. Mini-CEX, DOPS) should be used for assessing EPAs.
