Exploring Undergraduate Nursing Students' Experiences Towards Home-Based Learning as Pedagogy During the COVID-19 Pandemic: A Descriptive Qualitative Exploration



The global COVID-19 pandemic has led to the need for educators to explore online platforms in delivering lessons to students. Home-based learning is one of the most commonly-used teaching methods that allow learning to take place despite a physical separation between the students and the educators. This study explored the experiences of nursing undergraduates when using home-based learning as a pedagogy during the COVID-19 pandemic. Results suggested that universities should continue to incorporate more home-based learning opportunities into the existing nursing curricula in order to test their capacities and address technical challenges in online learning.
