Simulated Patients and Telepsychiatry to Enhance Education



A standardized patient telepsychiatry virtual encounter is a formative evaluation of clinical interview skills, presentation skills, and documentation skills from multiple parties.

In addition to grades for the oral presentation and documentation after the encounter, students receive prompt formative feedback on interview skills from both the standardized patient and educator, feedback and grade on oral presentation skills from the educator, and grade on documentation skills from the educator.

It allows educators to observe a live interview between student and standardized patient with all parties physically separated, of interest to institutions affected by COVID-19 or with geographically separated learners.

Exploration of Three Allied Health Professions' Perceptions of the Supervisory Relationship and its Impact on Feedback Practices



This is a two-part exploratory study. In the first part, we sought to explore supervisees' perceptions and supervisors' perceptions of their existing or most recent supervisory relationship. Supervisees' perceptions were explored using the Supervisory Relationship Questionnaire (SRQ) while supervisors' perceptions were explored using the Supervisory Relationship Measure (SRM).



We were also interested to understand the feedback reception (supervisees) and provision (supervisor) experiences and how this interacted with the supervisory relationship. As such, we sought to do so in the second part of our study where interested participants underwent semi-structured interviews.
