Coaching as an Educator: Identifying the Coachable Moments With Your Students

Extending Supervision of Speech Therapists in the Workplace: The Impact on the Supervisory Relationship



There is a perceived impact on the supervisory relationship when a new graduate (preceptee) requires extended workplace supervision due to unsatisfactory performance. Such a phenomenon is increasingly prevalent in the Singaporean Speech Therapy community. Limited research is available about how these graduates feel, as well as extending supervision in the context of an employer-employee relationship compared to that of a teacher-student relationship. This presentation provides a framework of how preceptors and preceptees negotiate such events in the workplace, and provides insight into how we can best prepare new graduates as they enter the workforce.
