Course Description

Humanism is the basic tenet of medicine in providing empathetic patient care. It promotes the development of positive attributes such as honesty, altruism, compassion, integrity and respect among our trainees. Training humanism has also shown healthcare practitioners will develop empathetic attitude towards the patients. This allows trainees to have a deeper understanding of patient's beliefs, thoughts and values and also connects trainees with the patient's families, relatives and caregivers. Approaches to developing humanistic qualities in medicine have been studied or research widely which includes didactic teaching and experiential learning. This course is designed to equip educators involved in mentoring, and shaping student's professional identity formation, and educators involved in communications skills and professionalism training in the undergraduate and postgraduate medical education setting.
