### Part 1: Sharing on Disseminating Your Scholarly Research in a Journal on Health Professions Education



Scholarly work is of great importance in health education for program evaluation, accreditation, promotion and tenure. Scholarship results in a product that is shared with others and is subject to the criticism of peers qualified to judge the product. The most well-known scholarly product is the journal article. Many health educators are passionate to increase their leadership capabilities in educational scholarship but struggle to become a successful scholar. Partially this is caused by the fact that in general healthcare professionals are trained in the health sciences and not

specifically in the educational sciences. Both areas have very different origins and apply different concepts and assumptions as a basis for inquiry. This makes it sometimes difficult for health sciences educators to be successful in educational research and publishing. This session will introduce educational scholarship practice, and how to best prepare for successful publishing in the field of health professions education.
