

Instructions for Free Communications Presenters

During the Conference

The format for your presentation during the virtual conference will be as follows:

- o 3 minutes: Present the key take-home points in a single PowerPoint slide
- 3 minutes: Q&A by judges (and participants if time permit)

Only the presenting author should be doing the presentation in the video and addressing the queries during the Q&A segment at the conference.

You will be assigned to one of the 1-hour sessions. We shall inform you of the date and time at a later date.

Prior to the Conference

Please see below regarding the items you will need to submit prior to the conference.

- 1. Presentation Video [MPEG-4 (.mp4) file format]
- In view of the online platform, presenters will need to do a pre-recording of their presentation (8 minutes for Free Communications) and send to us by the date indicated in our email.
- This video will be:
 - Evaluated by judges prior to the conference. The scores will be combined with the scores from the Q&A segment during the actual conference to decide on the winners.
 - o Make available for viewing by the participants throughout the entire conference accessible via the online conference platform.
- The <u>video submitted will be deemed as final</u> and no further change/s is/are allowed.
- Videos received after the stipulated date or do not conform to the guidelines (including time limit) will <u>not</u> be considered for the awards. Judges will only evaluate the video content for up to 8 minutes; any content beyond 8 minutes will not be viewed or scored.
- The link for the video upload page will be sent closer to the submission date.
- 2. Slide on Take-Home Points [PPT file format]
- Kindly send us one slide containing the key take-home points by the date indicated in our email. This will be shared during your assigned slot at the main conference.

1. Preparing Your Pre-Recording

Free Communications presenters will have a time limit of 8 minutes presentation.

- 1. Your pre-recording will contain both your content slide(s) and a voice-over. The presentation must be recorded in 720p
- 2. You may embed a video of yourself presenting the content [picture-in-picture (PiP)]. This PiP will appear at the bottom of each slide. The minimum dimensions for the video frame are height of 720 px and width of 1280 px
- 3. Presentation slides should be in English, landscape orientation
- 4. Slide dimensions In MS PowerPoint, go to Design -> Slide Size -> 16:9 (widescreen)
- 5. Text used for the PowerPoint should be no smaller than font size 24
- 6. The presentation should have a title slide and the following sections: Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion
- 7. The title slide should contain the following: Name(s), department(s), institution(s) and country of author(s) should be stated clearly, directly below the title. Name of the presenting author in bold
- 8. Presenters should avoid overloading their slide with text, or images with small elements to allow for better reading

Saving Your Presentation

You will need to save the file in MPEG-4 (.mp4) format:

For PowerPoint

- o Select "File" from the navigation bar at the top of the screen, followed by "Export".
- o Choose to "Create a Video".
- Select the MPEG-4 (.mp4) option from the drop-down menu. It is extremely important that you do not save your video in any format lower than Internet quality.
- Select the Create Video button.
- Files should be saved in the format:
 - Abstract ID_Presentation type (i.e. Free Comm)_First name_ Last name
 - o E.g. 1000 Free Comm Matthew Tan

2. Preparing Your Take-Home Points Slide

- 1. The one slide should be in English, landscape orientation
- 2. Slide dimensions In MS PowerPoint, go to Design -> Slide Size -> 16:9 (widescreen)
- 3. Text used for the PowerPoint should be no smaller than font size 24
- 4. It should contain the following at the top: Name(s) and affiliations should be stated clearly, directly below the title. Name of the presenting author in bold
- 5. Files should be saved in the format:
 - Abstract ID_Presentation type (i.e. Free Comm)_First name_ Last name E.g. 1000 Free Comm Matthew Tan
