Synopsis:

Patient-reported outcome measures (PROMs) capture patients' perspectives on their health, quality of life, and the outcomes that matter most to them. PROMs enable healthcare providers to gain insights into the patient experience and allow patients to take an active role in their care. PROMs can also help identify symptoms, concerns, and needs that might otherwise be missed, enabling timely interventions. Furthermore, policymakers can make use of PROMs to identify trends, assess health systems performance, and evaluate the real-world effectiveness of interventions. This data-driven approach supports the shift towards value-based care, where healthcare quality is defined not only by clinical outcomes but also by the patients' perceived benefits. The opportunity to embed PROMs in both practice and policy has transformative potential.

About the Speaker:

Prof. Jose M Valderas has received funding from public funding bodies and charities in the UK, Singapore, Spain, and Norway and from the Organisation for Economic Co-operation & Development (OECD) for research into different aspects of the development, evaluation, implementation and use of patient reported experiences and outcomes while holding appointments at Johns Hopkins University, the Universities of Oxford, Manchester and Exeter, and the London School of Economics. He was elected by his peers as President of the International Society for Quality of Life Research. He has provided expert advice to the World Health Organization (WHO), the OECD, the Wellcome Trust and NHS England on patient reported quality indicators. He is currently Field Chief Editor of *Frontiers in Health Services*.
