Patient reported outcomes measures (PROMs) are standardised questionnaires used to capture patients' own assessment of how their condition and treatment have affected their health and wellbeing. Evidence shows that using PROMs can enhance overall quality of care and drive quality improvements in health systems. Yet, the systematic implementation of PROMs faces many challenges.

This Policy Dialogue will launch the latest **CRIHSP Policy Briefing on PROMs** and review its key messages in how a structured and targeted approach can deliver meaningful results. It will then discuss key issues in how PROMs can be best implemented to advance value-based healthcare in Singapore with an expert panel of speakers.
