MASTER OF MENTAL HEALTH & PSYCHOTHERAPY

This Master's Degree by Coursework is an applied, skill-based academic training programme for mental health conditions, psychology interventions, psychotherapy & counselling, and case & care coordination.

It aims to provide higher education and advanced clinical training for the growing and evolving post-graduate learning needs of mental health professionals and practitioners in Singapore and the region.

Clinical mental health professionals require a diverse set of therapy skills to effectively address the needs of their clients. The programme encompasses research, screening and assessment for common mental health disorders, cognitive behaviour therapy, interpersonal psychotherapy, mindfulness, parenting, group psychotherapy, social skills training, and behavioural interventions.

The programme consulted industry experts and stakeholders to curate each module to match the National Mental Health Competency Training requirement to practise at Tier 2 and 3 of the Tiered Care Model.

Admission Criteria

All candidates must demonstrate readiness for graduate study and meet the following minimum requirements:

- Hold a relevant Bachelor's degree from a recognised university with at least an Honours or its equivalent (High grade Pass degree) in Psychology, Medicine, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Allied Health, Social Work.*
- Have at least 1-3 years in providing direct care to persons with mental health issues.
- A good pass degree will be assessed on a case-bycase basis.
- Pass an admission interview by the core programme faculty.
- Provide two professional referee reports on their character and professional competency are required to complete the application. The referees can be their academic mentors, current employers or previous employers.

*Preference will be given to candidates with an honours degree, appropriate work experience, and a relevant background in the aforementioned subject.

English Proficiency

English proficiency test scores is a requirement for all international applicants except those whose undergraduate or graduate degrees are from NUS, NTU, SMU or SUTD, or from English-speaking countries such as Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and the United States.

To meet the English requirement for our programme, the following are the minimum scores that should be achieved:

- Provide evidence of a minimum IELTS score of 7 or a TOEFL iBT score of 94 (with minimum of 23 for the writing section) to establish proficiency in English if this is not their first language, for international candidates.
- All IELTS / TOEFL tests must have been taken not earlier than 2 years before the proposed date of admission.
- Pass any preparatory modules as indicated by the core programme staff on a case-by-case basis.

Stackable Certificates

The MCMHP programme is stackable to cater to the different backgrounds and interests of potential students. The stackable model pathway is suitable for non-clinically trained professionals and mid-career switchers. Students can transfer credits from the following graduate certificates and executive certificate taken within 5 years. Students will have to complete a workshop, a symposium, 2 clinical placements, and a capstone project to meet the graduation requirements of the MCMHP programme.

Executive Certificate in **Public Mental Health** 2 modules (4 units); 2 semesters



Graduate Certificate in **Psychotherapy** 6 modules (12 units); 2 semesters



Programme Structure

Students will be taught evidence-based practices and therapeutic skills to provide direct support and design interventions for persons with mental health challenges. Students will be able to detect the mental health needs of patients or clients, provide counselling, stress and anxiety management, social skills training, behaviour management, mental health assessment and psychotherapy, such as cognitive behavioural therapy, systemic therapy and interpersonal psychotherapy.




