OVERVIEW OF THE PROGRAMME

The Child and Family Health (CFH) encompass the professional and academic fields that focus on the determinants, mechanisms and systems that promote and maintain the health, safety, well-being, and appropriate development of children and their families in communities and societies, to enhance the future health and welfare of society and subsequent generations.

The GCCFH aims to upskill the competency of Registered Nurses, Allied Health, Social and Education professionals in alignment with the Ministry of Health (MOH) strategic direction to provide holistic and comprehensive support to women and their children to attain good health and well-being.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

This programme addresses the interactions among social, cultural, educational and health services factors that influence the health of populations of women, children, and families. Upon completion of the programme, graduates will be able to:

- Describe determinants of health and life course theory in influencing population health.
- Illustrate the purpose, rationale, activities, and performance measures for promoting care to women, children, and their families.
- Apply evidence-based practice to primary care within the scope of the CFH services.
- Critically analyse and apply the principles of primary health care to promote and maintain wellbeing for children, women, and their families.

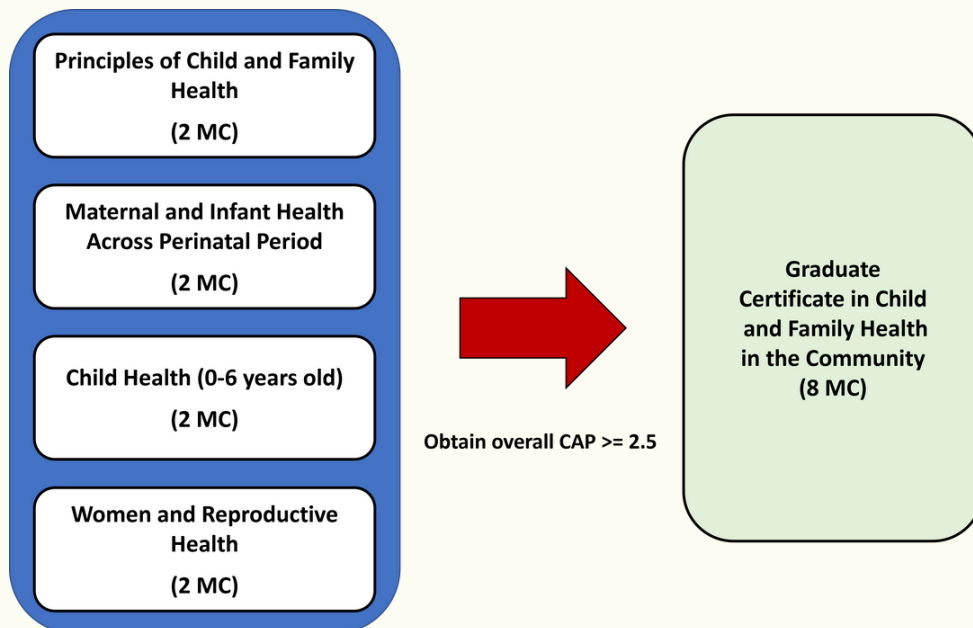

Entry Requirements

The programme is designed for individuals working in a variety of community, primary health, and general practice setting, i.e. Registered Nurses, Allied health, Social and Education professionals with relevant degrees. Candidates for admission to the Graduate Certificate in Child & Family Health in the Community require:

- A Bachelor's degree or its equivalent in a related discipline.
- At least one (1) year work experience in a related discipline.
- Registered with the respective professional boards (e.g. Singapore Nursing Board and Allied Health Professions Council).
