Entry Requirements

The programme is designed for individuals working in a variety of community, primary health, and general practice setting, i.e. Registered Nurses, Allied health, Social and Education professionals with relevant degrees. Candidates for admission to the Master of Community Health require:

- A Bachelor's degree or its equivalent in a related discipline.
- At least two (2) year work experience in a related discipline.

2. Upload all supporting documents into the Graduate Admission System (GDA3), refer to the Application Checklist.

3. Except for NUS graduates, all other applicants must obtain an official transcript of academic records from the university you have attended for your Bachelor's or Master's Degree.
