2. DNP Project Proposal (*Maximum: 1500 words, excluding references*)

1). Title of Project

- Provide a concise and descriptive title for your proposed DNP project.

2). Background and Significance

- Describe the clinical or healthcare problem your project addresses.
- Explain why this issue is significant to nursing practice and patient outcomes.
- Provide supporting evidence or literature to justify the need for this project.

3). Project Objectives

- Clearly outline the objectives or aims of your project.
- Indicate what outcomes you expect to achieve.

4). Methodology

- Describe the approach or framework you plan to use (e.g., Quality Improvement, Implementation Science, Program Development).
- Explain the setting, population, and key stakeholders involved.
- Outline the data collection methods (e.g., surveys, interviews, patient outcome measures).

5). Expected Impact and Relevance to Nursing Practice

- Discuss how your project will contribute to improving clinical practice, healthcare policy, or patient outcomes.
- Explain how your project aligns with the DNP role in advancing nursing leadership and evidence-based practice.

6). Timeline and Feasibility

- Provide a general timeline for project implementation and evaluation.
- Indicate potential barriers and how you plan to address them.

7). References (*APA 7th edition format*)

- List key references that support your project proposal.
