## **Rules**

- A single static PowerPoint slide is permitted (no slide transitions, animations or 'movement' of any description). The slide is to be presented from the beginning of the oration.
- No additional electronic media (e.g. sound and video files) are permitted.
- No additional props (e.g. costumes, musical instruments, laboratory equipment) are permitted.
- Presentations are limited to maximum 3 minutes and competitors exceeding 3 minutes would be disqualified.
- Presentations are to be spoken words (e.g. no poems, raps or songs).
- Presentations are to commence from the stage.
- Presentations are considered to have commenced when a presenter starts their presentation through movement or speech.
- The decision of the adjudicating panel is final.

## **Judging Criteria**

The judging criteria for NUS 3MT will be identical to those used in national and international 3MT competitions. It is summarized below:

Each judge will rate each presentation based on the following 12 judging criteria:

- 1. Did the presentation provide an understanding of the background to the research question being addressed and its significance?
- 2. Did the presentation clearly describe the key results of the research including conclusions and outcomes?
- 3. Did the presentation follow a clear and logical sequence?
- 4. Was the thesis topic, key results and research significance and outcomes communicated in language appropriate to a non-specialist audience?
- 5. Did the speaker avoid scientific jargon, explain terminology and provide adequate background information to illustrate points?
- 6. Did the presenter spend adequate time on each element of their presentation or did they elaborate for too long on one aspect or was the presentation rushed?

## **Engagement & Communication**

- 7. Did the oration make the audience want to know more?
- 8. Was the presenter careful not to generalize their research?
- 9. Did the presenter convey enthusiasm for their research?
- 10. Did the presenter capture and maintain their audience's attention?
- 11. Did the speaker have sufficient stage presence, eye contact and vocal range; maintain a steady pace, and have a confident stance?
- 12. Did the PowerPoint slide enhance the presentation was it clear, legible, and concise?

A minimum of 1 point (Very Poor) and a maximum of 5 points (Excellent) can be awarded for each judging criteria. The total points awarded to each entry by the judges will be added up and the entries will be ranked accordingly.
