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PubMed

PubMed is a free resource that allows users to search for biomedical, health care, dental, nursing and life science journal citations and abstracts.

In this hands-on workshop, participants will learn how to:

- 1) Search PubMed effectively using keywords and MeSH (controlled vocabulary)

- 2) Refine their searches to retrieve relevant citations for their topics
- 3) Manage citations - change display format, collect, email, save, print, etc.
- 4) Create current awareness profiles to be informed of new citations for their topics
- 5) Access full-text of articles via PubMed



EndNote®

EndNote® is a software for managing references. It enables students and authors to save hours of typing when creating bibliographies for term papers, thesis/ dissertations, grant proposals, publications and curricula vitae. EndNote® saves authors the tedium of interpreting style requirements and formats references instantly into many predefined citation styles.

From the workshop, participants will learn to use EndNote® to:

- 1) Import saved citations from relevant sources (like PubMed) into End-Note®. Learn the various ways of

adding a reference to a library of references: manually, exporting and importing from library catalogs and online databases, connecting from EndNote® itself.

- 2) Organize references into Groups
- 3) Use the Cite While You Write® feature so that references stored in End-Note® can be cited in a Microsoft Word 2010 document
- 4) Insert and instantly format citations in Microsoft Word using pre-defined citation styles
